6. What was John the Baptist's purpose/role?
7. According to this passage, what was John the Baptist's message? Do the other gospel accounts tell us any more about John the Baptist's message?
8. In what way is our purpose/role the same as John the Baptist's? Is our purpose/role different in any way?
9. Why do you think the world did not recognise or receive Jesus the "true light"?
10. How can Jesus give us the right to become children of God?
11. What does it mean that we can become "children born not of natural descent, but born of God"?
12. What might the world be like if the Word didn't become flesh and dwell among us?
13. How is the grace & truth of Jesus different to the grace & truth that was given through the law of Moses?
14. How would you explain verse 18 to someone that wanted to know about Jesus?
15. How does Colossians 1:15-20 add to what we have read in John 1:1-18?
