Warming up:

When was a time that you experienced God's goodness?

Read Numbers 21:4-9

- 1. Where is Mt Hor? (Have a look at a map in the back of your Bible or Google it)
- 2. Why were the Israelites upset and impatient?
- 3. Why is it a big deal for the Israelites to call the food (manna) worthless and grumble against God's provision?
- 4. How did the people respond to God's discipline? Did it have its intended outcome?
- 5. In John 3:14-15, Jesus says that "Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so [he] must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him" How is Jesus's crucifixion similar/different to this story in Numbers 21?

Read Psalm 107:1-3,17-22

- 6. As the Israelites gave thanks to God for his goodness and steadfast love, what stories might come to mind?
- 7. Why is it important for the Israelites and for us to remember those times when God has been with us in times of trouble?
- 8. In what ways do we continue to be foolish just as the Israelites were?
- 9. What do vv.19-20 tell us about God's character and nature?
- 10. What does all of this teach us about our need to obey God and trust in him?

How does knowing God's compassion and loving-kindness change the way you pray? List 3 ways you can choose to walk in obedience to God ways this week.
