- 4. What are the similarities and differences between John's message and Jesus'?
- 5. Who does Jesus call as his first disciples? How does he call them?
- 6. What did Jesus find the disciples doing? What does Jesus call them to do? Why is this significant?
- 7. How do the disciples respond to Jesus' call?
- 8. It seems that these men belonged to good family businesses. Why do you think they were prepared to leave their family and their expensive boats and nets to follow Jesus?
- 9. Why do you think Jesus called these fishermen and not well-learned people in Jerusalem?
- 10. What does all of this tell you about Jesus and his ministry?
- 11. What does all of this tell you about our call to mission?
- 12. If Jesus didn't need helpers to accomplish his mission, but invited these disciples to join him anyway, what does this tell you about Jesus?

- How is Jesus calling you to 'fish for people' in your day-to-day life?
- What can you be asking the Holy Spirit for in prayer to help you in this important ministry and calling?
