• Can you remember a time you were so desperate for something (e.g., a job, food, money, healing, etc.), that you were prepared to do anything to get it? What was it like?

Read Mark 5:21-43

- 1. Jesus heals two people in this passage. What do they have in common?
- 2. Why is Jairus so desperate for Jesus to heal his daughter? Why is his job significant?
- 3. Why is it difficult for Jesus to move quickly to help Jairus' daughter?
- 4. Why is the woman so desperate for Jesus to heal her? What causes the sick woman to reach out to Jesus?
- 5. Once she's healed, how does Jesus treat the woman?
- 6. What can we learn from this woman and the way Jesus treats her?
- 7. What do the people come and tell Jairus in verse 35? How does Jesus respond?
- 8. Why does Jesus go to Jairus' house, even after his daughter has died?
- 9. How does Jesus go about healing Jairus' daughter? Why do you think that Jesus kicks everyone out of the room?
- 10. What do verses 42-43 tell us about the little girl's healing?
- 11. What do these two healings tell us about Jesus?

- What hope can these stories give us today?
- How can they influence how we pray for the people around us?
